Description

Situated in the heart of the popular Coundon suburb, this distinctive single-storey former library building offers a rare opportunity to occupy a well-positioned community landmark.

The property comprises a traditionally constructed brick-built premises with a pitched tiled roof, benefitting from prominent roadside frontage along Moseley Avenue. Internally, the layout includes an open-plan main hall area with high ceilings, offices, accessible toilet facilities and a staff kitchen area.

While originally configured for public library use, the space is highly adaptable and suitable for a variety of uses under Use Class E that are subject to any necessary consents if required.

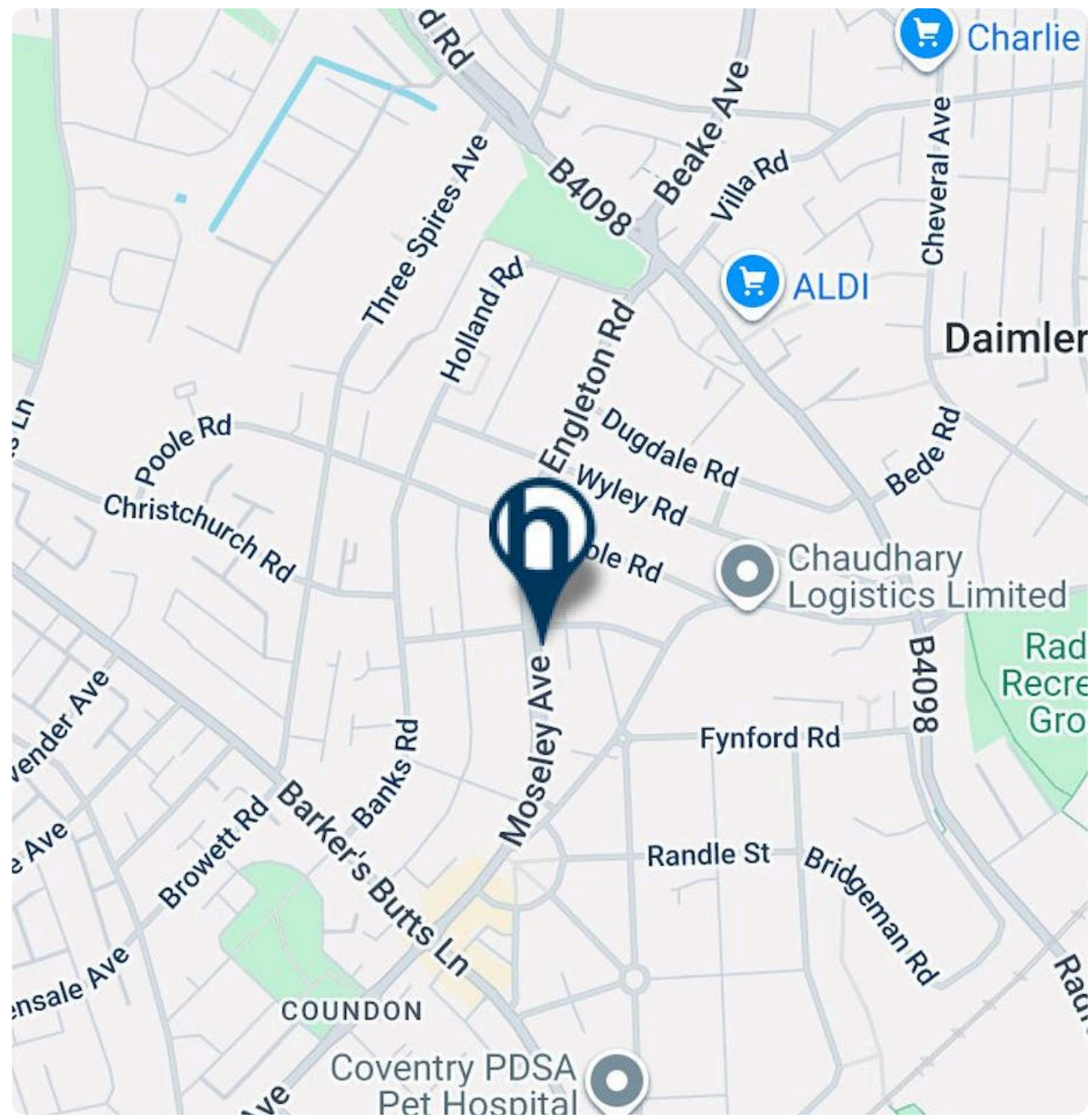


Location

Coundon Library is situated in a prominent suburban location approximately 1.5 miles northwest of Coventry city centre. The area is well-established, with a mix of residential housing, schools, local retail parades and community services.

Easily accessible via the B4106 (Barkers Butts Lane) and A4114 Holyhead Road, providing quick links to the city centre and the wider West Midlands road network.

The site offers strong community visibility, walk-in potential, and a loyal catchment area, making it suitable for continued public use.



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Coventry

Coventry is a city in central England. It's known for the medieval Coventry Cathedral, which was left in ruins after a WWII bombing. A 20th-century replacement, with abstract stained glass, stands beside it. The collection at the Herbert Art Gallery & Museum includes paintings of local heroine Lady Godiva. A statue of her, naked on horseback, is nearby. The 14th-century St. Mary's Guildhall has a vaulted crypt.

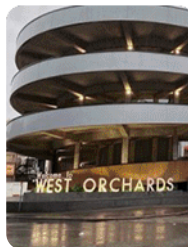
