Re: PUC Docket No. 59143; *Joint Application of Rayburn Country Electric Cooperative, Inc. and Oncor Electric Delivery Company LLC to Amend their Respective Certificates of Convenience and Necessity for the Canton to Alder 138-kV Transmission Line Project in Van Zandt County*

Dear Paul Stanford:

Rayburn Country Electric Cooperative, Inc. ("REC") and Oncor Electric Delivery Company LLC ("Oncor") (collectively, "Joint Applicants") give notice that they are requesting approval from the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission" or "PUC") to amend their respective Certificates of Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") to construct, own, and operate a new Canton to Alder 138-kV transmission line and Oncor's new Alder Switch in Van Zandt County, Texas. Joint Applicants have filed an application with the PUC for this purpose in Docket No. 59143. The proposed project will provide looped transmission service to REC's existing Canton Substation to improve service reliability to the member-consumers of Trinity Valley Electric Cooperative, Inc. in the area.

The proposed single-circuit, double-circuit capable 138-kV transmission line will be built on double-circuit steel monopoles between REC's existing Canton Substation, located on the east side of State Highway ("SH") 19 approximately 0.35 mile south of the Farm-to-Market Road ("FM") 1651 intersection, and Oncor's proposed Alder Switch, to be located along Oncor's existing Canton Switch to Explorer Pipeline 138-kV transmission line approximately 0.30 mile east of SH 198 and 0.90 mile south of FM 3227. The proposed project is presented with alternative routes ranging in length from 3.8 to 5.5 miles, but may vary depending on the route selected by the PUC. The estimated cost of the project ranges from approximately \$24,676,818 to \$31,103,710, depending on the route selected.

Your land may be directly affected by this docket. If one of the Joint Applicants' alternative routes is approved by the PUC, Joint Applicants will have the right to build a facility that might directly affect your land. This docket will not determine the value of your land or the value of an easement if one is needed by Joint Applicants to build the facility. All routes and route segments included in this notice are available for selection and approval by the Public Utility Commission of Texas.

The enclosed brochure entitled “Landowners and Transmission Line Cases at the PUC” provides basic information about how you may participate in this docket, and how you may contact the PUC. Please read this brochure carefully. Joint Applicants also enclose sample forms for making comments and for making a request to intervene as a party in this docket. ***The only way to fully participate in the PUC’s decision on where to locate the transmission line is to intervene in the docket. It is important for an affected person to intervene because the utility is not obligated to keep affected persons informed of the PUC’s proceedings and cannot predict which route may or may not be approved by the PUC.***

In addition to the contacts listed in the brochure, you may call the PUC’s Customer Assistance Hotline at (512) 936-7120 or toll-free at (888) 782-8477. Hearing and speech impaired individuals with text telephones (TTY) may contact the Commission through Relay Texas at 1-800-735-2989. If you wish to participate in this docket by becoming an intervenor, the deadline for intervention in the proceeding is **January 29, 2026**, which is 30 days after filing of the application. The PUC should receive a letter from you requesting intervention by that date if you choose to intervene. The request to intervene form is enclosed with this letter.

The preferred method for you to file your request for intervention is electronically. If you decide to file an electronic request for intervention, you will be required to serve the request on all other parties by email. Therefore, please include your own email address on the intervention form. While the preferred method for submitting a request for intervention is electronically, you may file your request by mailing a hard copy to the PUC. Any intervention request must be received by the PUC by the intervention deadline of **January 29, 2026**. Persons who wish to intervene in the docket must also email or mail a copy of their request for intervention to all parties in the docket and all persons that have pending motions to intervene, at or before the time the request for intervention is electronically filed with, or mailed to, the PUC. In addition to the intervention deadline, other important deadlines may already exist that affect your
