MARKET OVERVIEW



GOVERNMENT & REGIONAL ROLE

Rapid City serves as the primary economic and service hub for western South Dakota and the broader Black Hills region. It plays a key role in regional governance, housing federal, state, and local offices, as well as Ellsworth Air Force Base—an important military installation that contributes significantly to the local economy.
