STATE OF WISCONSIN BROKER DISCLOSURE



Wisconsin law requires all real estate licensees to give the following information about brokerage services to prospective customers.

Confidentiality Notice to Customers

The Firm and its Agents will keep confidential any information given to the Firm or its Agents in confidence, or any information obtained by the Firm or its Agents that a reasonable person would want to be kept confidential, unless the information must be disclosed by law or you authorize the Firm to disclose particular information.
