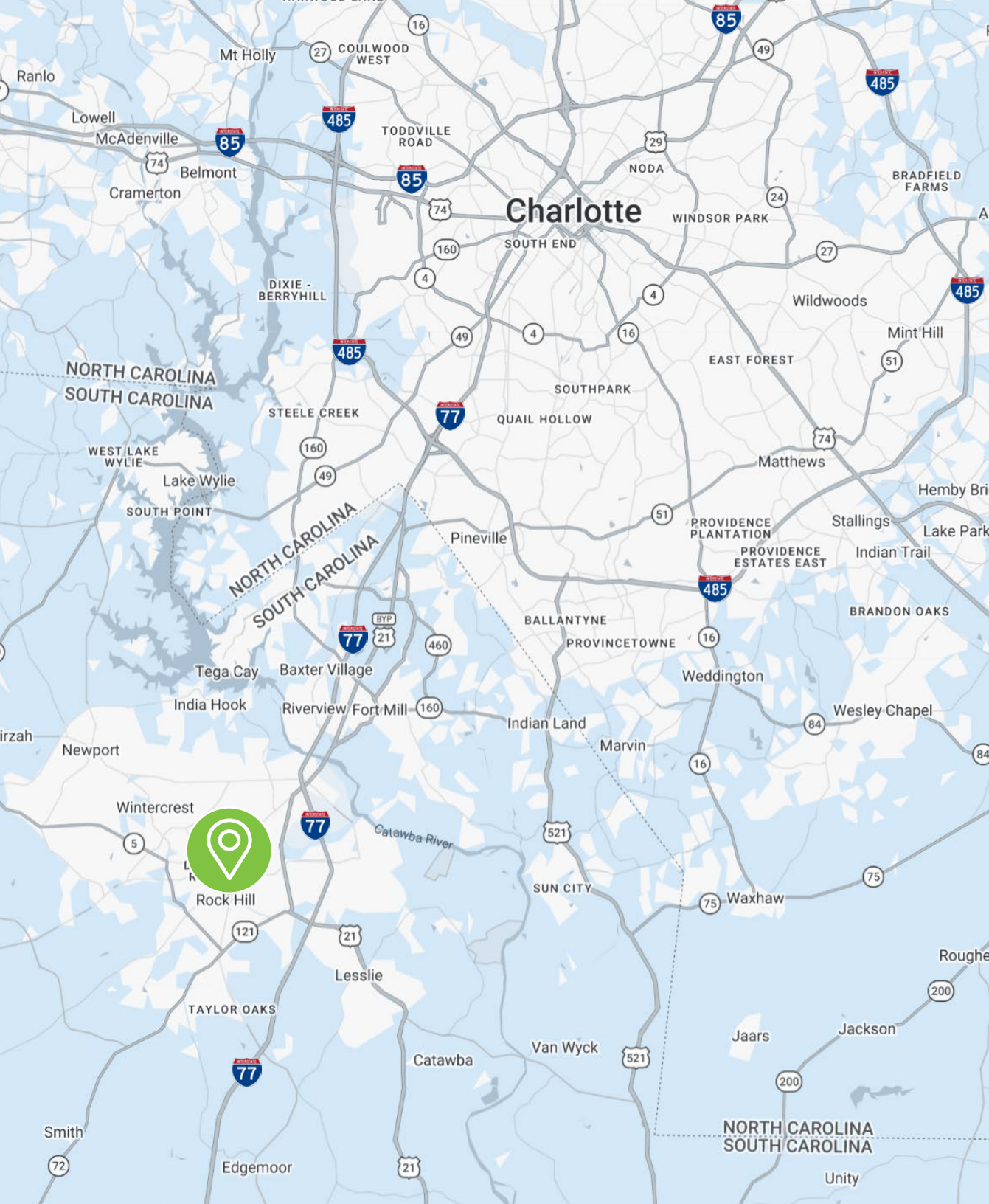

FLOOR PLAN

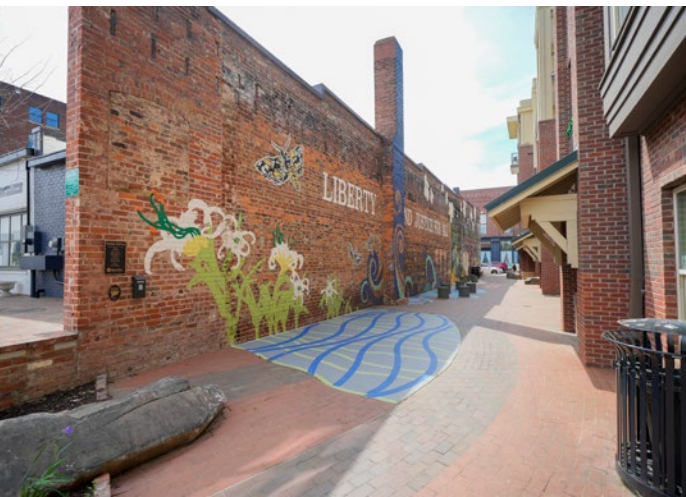

THE HISTORY: THE FRIENDSHIP NINE U.S. CIVIL RIGHTS TRAIL

The McCrory's Five & Dime in Rock Hill, South Carolina, and the actions of the Friendship Nine represent a pivotal moment in the American Civil Rights Movement. These events highlight how student-led, nonviolent protests challenged segregation in public spaces and introduced new strategic approaches to activism. The Friendship Nine's decision to embrace the "jail, no bail" tactic marked a turning point, strengthening the effectiveness and sustainability of sit-in movements across the South while leaving a lasting educational and moral legacy.

- McCrory's is a recognized stop on the U.S. Civil Rights Trail
- Feb. 12, 1960: Students launched sit-ins after being denied service
- Continued protests highlight the site's role in sustained Civil Rights activism
- Jan. 31, 1961: Students were arrested during a sit-in at the location
- The Friendship Nine chose jail over fines, a defining moment tied to the site
- "Jail, no bail" became a key Civil Rights Trail story and strategy
- Today, the site interprets this legacy through preservation and public education

DOWNTOWN ROCK HILL

Downtown Rock Hill is currently undergoing a massive transformation, fueled by more than \$400 million in active and planned investments. Often referred to as “Old Town,” the area is shifting from its industrial textile roots into a modern “Knowledge Park” that bridges Winthrop University with the city center.

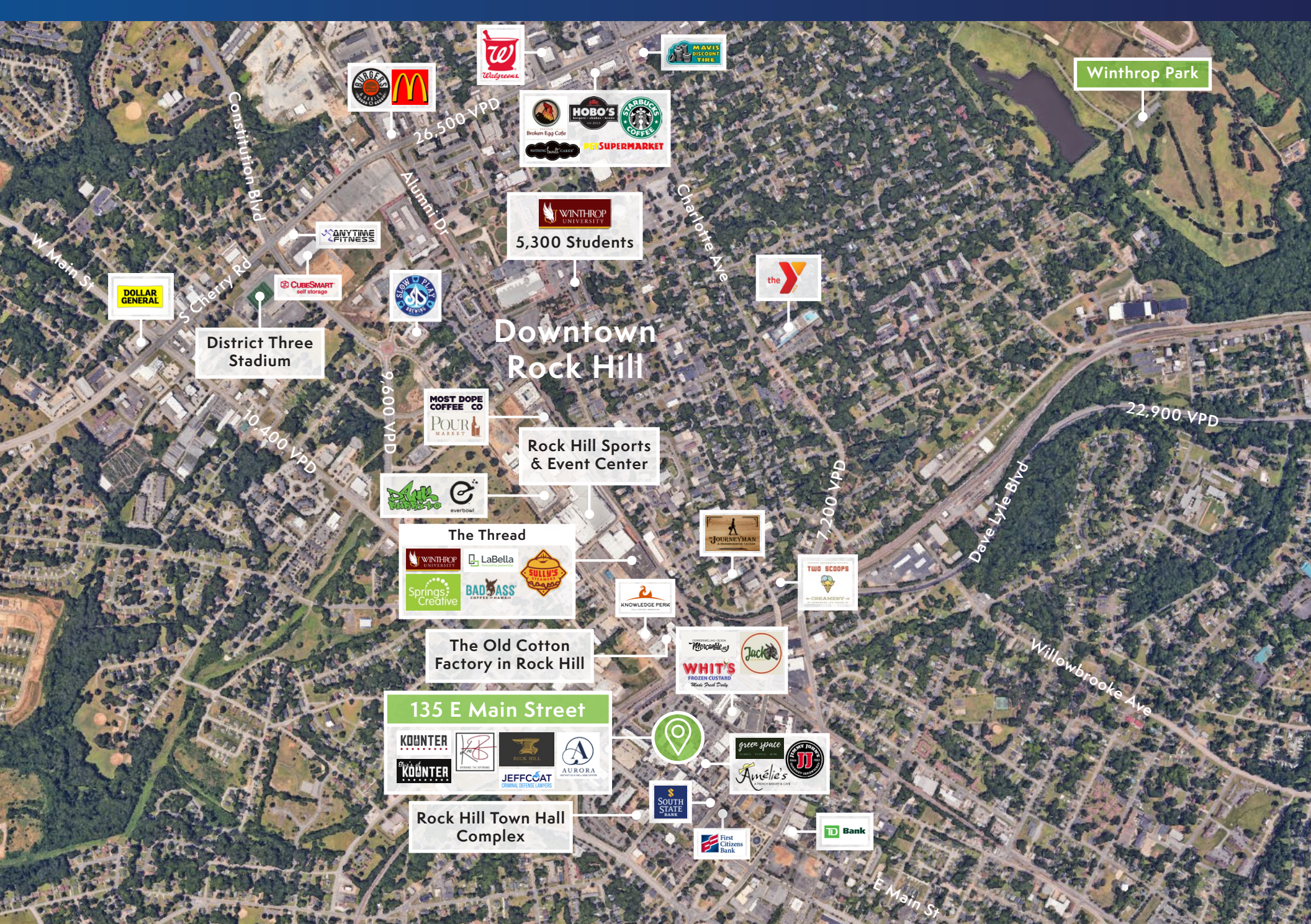

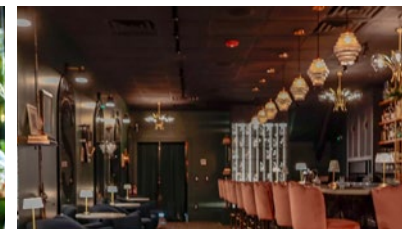
