Originally constructed in 1936 and expanded through 1988, this 131,000 SF industrial/flex asset carries the architectural heritage of a bygone era and the upside of a modern reinvention. Zoned MU and positioned in one of Chicagoland's most desirable western suburbs, the site is primed for a high-impact adaptive reuse — industrial, office, flex, or a business incubator hub.

The existing multi-tenant rent roll delivers meaningful NOI today — with substantial runway to scale. This is cash flow with a development story attached.

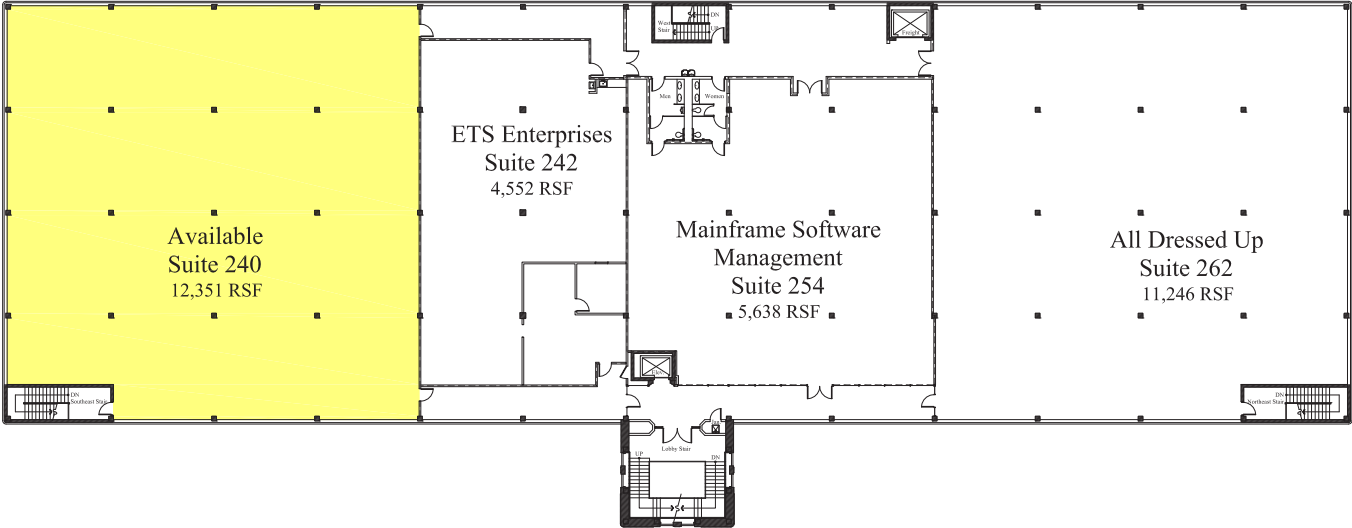

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Batavia, Illinois

Batavia is a charming city located in Kane and DuPage counties, part of the Chicago metropolitan area. Founded in 1833, it is the oldest city in Kane County and boasts a rich heritage.

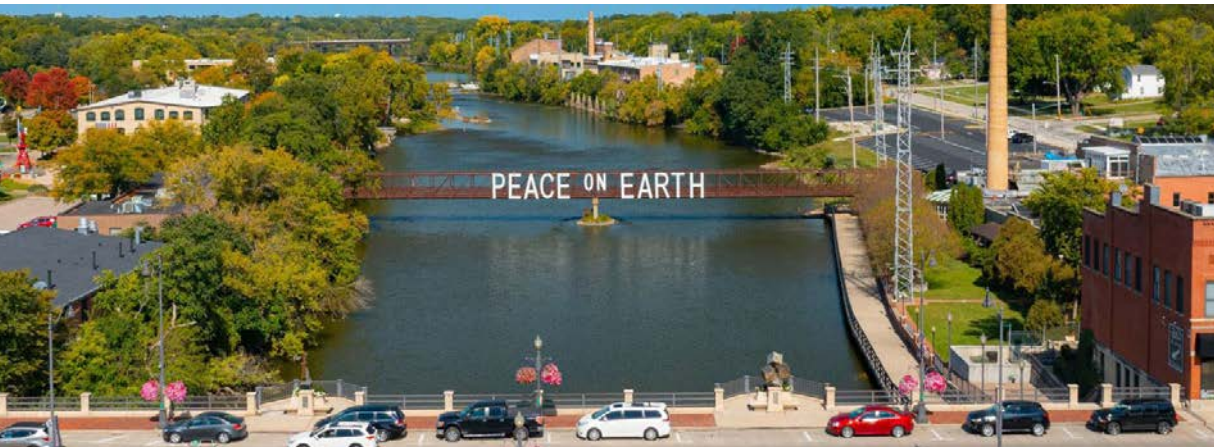
Batavia's downtown area exudes a quaint, historic charm with its boutique shops, intimate dining spots, and a picturesque riverwalk along the Fox River. The city takes pride in its traditions, such as the annual Christmas Tree Lane, 4th of July Fireworks Show, and the Windmill City Festival in mid-July.

Batavia is known for its strong sense of community and commitment to quality of life. The city's school district is highly regarded and ranked among the best in Illinois. Residents enjoy the modern public library facility and the expanding park system. Batavia is considered a safe and welcoming suburb, with friendly people and a small-town feel.

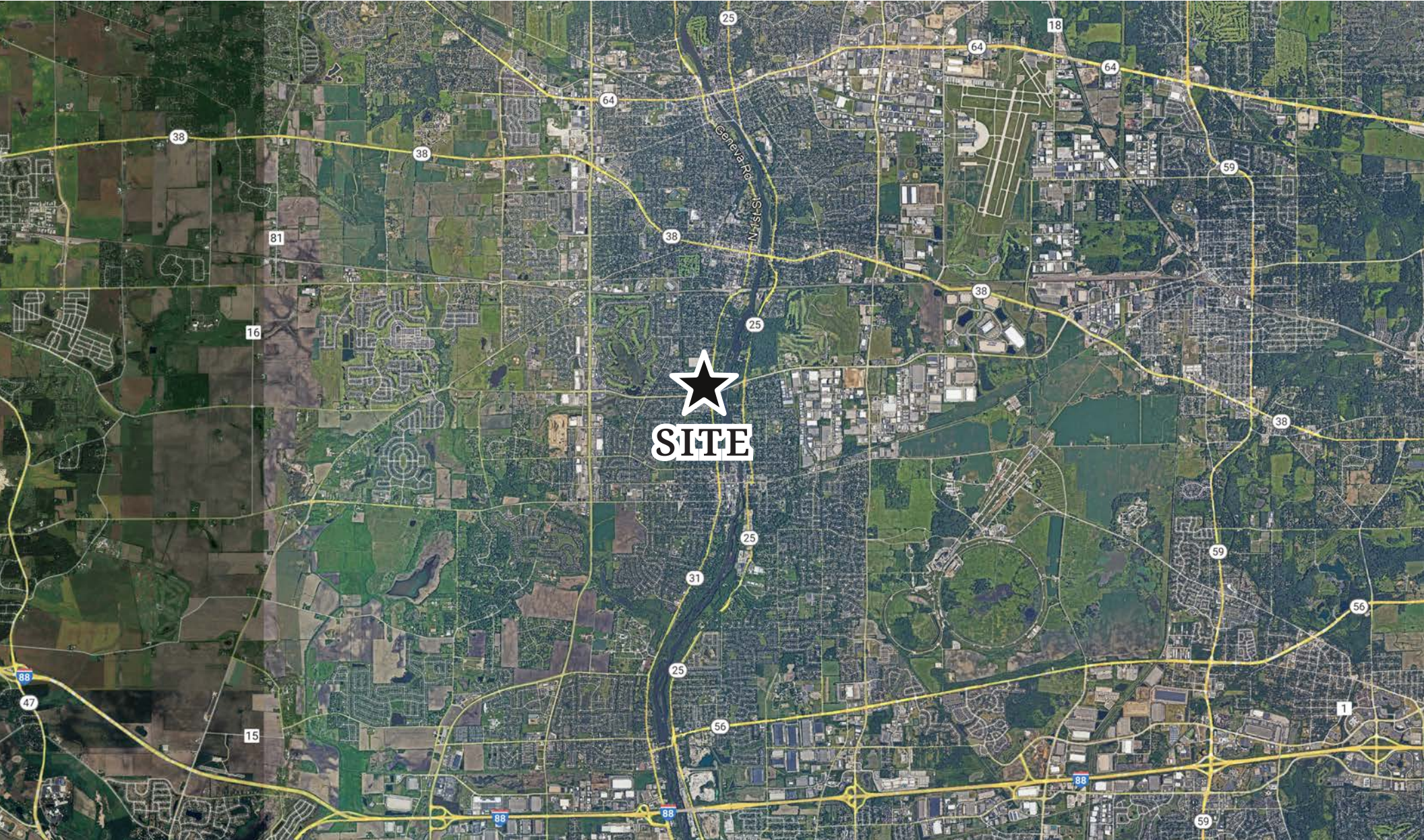

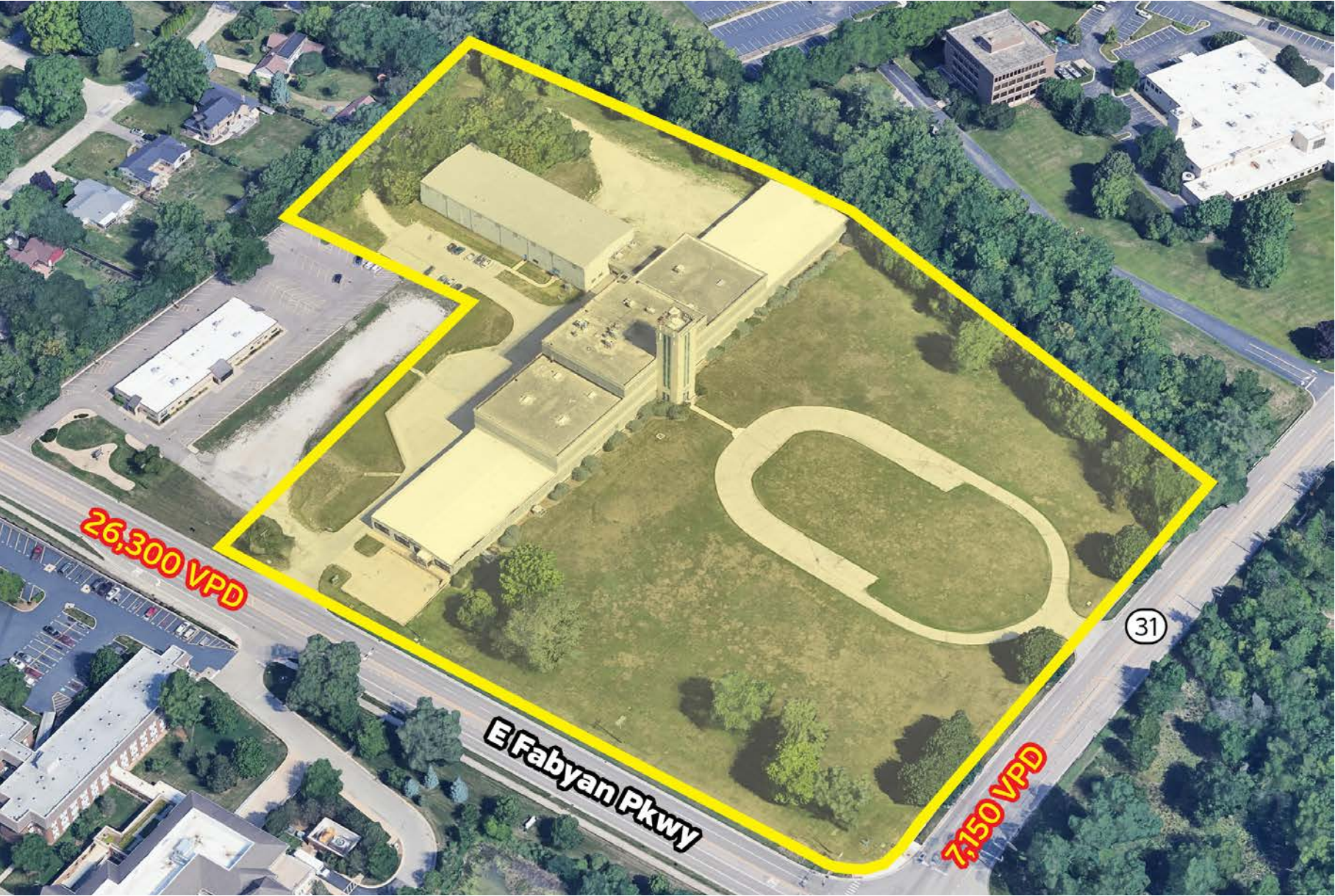
LOCATION MAP
