
Dear Mr. Rader:

The PHMSA Southern Region, Office of Pipeline Safety (OPS) received a letter from Mr. M. Benjamin Machlis dated March 2, 2015, an attorney with Holland & Hart, which represents Rentech, Inc. (Rentech). Enmark Energy, Inc. (Enmark) is the operator of record and Gulf Coast Synthetic Fuel Center, LLC (Gulf Coast), a subsidiary of Rentech, is the owner of the Rentech 6-inch natural gas pipeline and pipeline facilities in Louisiana and Mississippi, subject to the above referenced Final Order issued on April 4, 2014.

The letter included a copy of FERC's "*Order Approving Abandonment*" issued on February 6, 2015, which grants Gulf Coast the authority to abandon the referenced pipeline and associated appurtenances. Moreover, the Order clearly explains that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers required Gulf Coast to either upgrade or remove the pipeline portions atop three of its jurisdictional levees.

Since abandonment of the pipeline makes the compliance items in the Final Order moot, this case is now closed and no further action is necessary with respect to the matters involved in this case. Notwithstanding the closure of this Final Order, it must be noted that should Gulf Coast not abandon the pipeline and associated appurtenances, the pipeline owner and operator could be subject to further enforcement actions.

Enclosed please find Gulf Coast Synthetic Fuel Center, LLC's ("Gulf Coast") Notice to Landowner Regarding Application to Abandon Certain Pipeline Facilities in Tensas and Concordia Parishes, Louisiana and Adams County, Mississippi Pursuant to Section 7(b) of the Natural Gas Act. Also enclosed is a copy of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") notice issued in this proceeding. This notice includes important information regarding the easement currently held by Gulf Coast on your land.

In addition to the notice provided to all landowners, Gulf Coast is reaching out to you because the easement across your property (Parcel 400147004); unlike the majority of easements involved in the project, will revert back to you upon abandonment. Because the pipeline that runs through the easement has been inactive for a number of years, Gulf Coast plans to abandon the pipeline in place. If you would like for Gulf Coast to retain the easement, please call Mr. George Beary at (601) 874-4601 to discuss options for amending your current easement. If you decide not to amend your easement, please feel free to call Mr. Beary to discuss the abandon in place procedures or options thereto, such as removal. Pursuant to FERC's regulations, where the pipeline easement is not being retained by Gulf Coast, the landowner has the right to request all pipeline facilities be removed from their property.

Gulf Coast looks forward to discussing this project and your options with you.

**Notice to Landowner Regarding Application to Abandon Certain Pipeline Facilities in  
Tensas and Concordia Parishes, Louisiana and Adams County, Mississippi Pursuant to  
Section 7(b) of the Natural Gas Act**

Gulf Coast Synthetic Fuel Center, LLC ("Gulf Coast"), a wholly owned subsidiary of Rentech, Inc. and successor in interest to RSFC Land Management, LLC, is proposing to abandon a pipeline and associated pipeline facilities (the "Natchez Pipeline") which historically provided natural gas to the old International Paper mill site in Natchez, Mississippi (the "Natchez Mill"). Gulf Coast is abandoning the Natchez Pipeline because delivery of natural gas through the pipeline is currently and foreseeably unnecessary for future uses at the Natchez Mill site. Gulf Coast has attempted to locate a third party interested in acquiring the Pipeline; however, third parties, including those entities currently engaged in consumer gas distribution in the area, have been uninterested in the Pipeline due to its limited capacity.

On September 2, 2014, Gulf Coast filed an application to abandon the Natchez Pipeline. FERC assigned this prior notice request Docket No. CP14-546-000. You can obtain copies of the application and related documents by accessing the Docket on the eLibrary page of FERC's website, <http://elibrary.ferc.gov/idmws/search/fercgensearch.asp>, and entering the Docket No. provided above in the search criteria box labeled "Docket Number." You can also obtain a copy of the application by contacting Gulf Coast's local representative identified below. In accordance with FERC's procedures and rules, you have the right to participate in this proceeding. FERC published notice of this application on September 16, 2014, which provides relevant information regarding how to participate in the proceeding. A copy of that notice is enclosed herewith.

You are being notified because a portion of the Natchez Pipeline is located on or near your property. Notice was previously mailed to you regarding Gulf Coast's abandonment of the pipeline pursuant to Gulf Coast's blanket certificate; however, that request was withdrawn and this application filed. Accordingly, Gulf Coast is re-sending notifications to landowners. The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission publishes a pamphlet entitled Blanket Certificate Program Notice to Landowners, which can be accessed at <http://www.ferc.gov/industries/gas/indus-act/blank-cert/blanketcert.pdf>. This pamphlet explains the Commission's certificate process and addresses the basic concerns of landowners. Note that the scope of Gulf Coast's proposed abandonment project will differ from a project to install a pipeline. With regard to abandonment, page 8 of the pamphlet states:

If a pipeline is abandoned, the Commission will consider whether there are environmental or other conditions that should determine the disposition of the pipeline. If the Commission finds there are no such issues, the easement agreement which you or previous landowners signed may stipulate whether the buried pipeline is to be removed. You may also come to some agreement with the company on what they will do with the pipeline. The Commission typically requires that all abandoned above-ground facilities be removed.

Take notice that on September 2, 2014, Gulf Coast Synthetic Energy Center (Gulf Coast), LLC, 10877 Wilshire Boulevard, Suite 1000, Los Angeles, California 90024, filed in Docket No. CP14-546-000 an application pursuant to section 7(b) of the Natural Gas Act (NGA) requesting authorization to abandon its pipeline facilities located in Tensas and Concordia Parishes, Louisiana; and Adams County, Mississippi and its Part 157, Subpart F blanket certificate issued under Docket No. CP08-415-000, all as more fully set forth in the application which is on file with the Commission and open to public inspection. The filing may also be viewed on the web at <http://www.ferc.gov> using the "eLibrary" link. Enter the docket number excluding the last three digits in the docket number field to access the document. Specifically, Gulf Coast proposes to abandon approximately 17.83 miles of 6<sup>5/8</sup> inch diameter pipeline, a 1,000 feet of 6 inch diameter pipeline lateral, a 200 horsepower compressor station, and appurtenant facilities, including a crossing of the Mississippi River.

Pursuant to section 157.9 of the Commission's rules, 18 CFR § 157.9, within 90 days of this Notice the Commission staff will either complete its environmental assessment (EA) and place it into the Commission's public record (eLibrary) for this proceeding; or issue a Notice of Schedule for Environmental Review. If a Notice of Schedule for Environmental Review is issued, it will indicate, among other milestones, the anticipated date for the Commission staff's issuance of the final environmental impact statement (FEIS) or EA for this proposal. The filing of the EA in the Commission's public record for this proceeding or the issuance of a Notice of Schedule for Environmental Review will serve to notify federal and state agencies of the timing for the completion of all necessary reviews, and the subsequent need to complete all federal authorizations within 90 days of the date of issuance of the Commission staff's FEIS or EA.

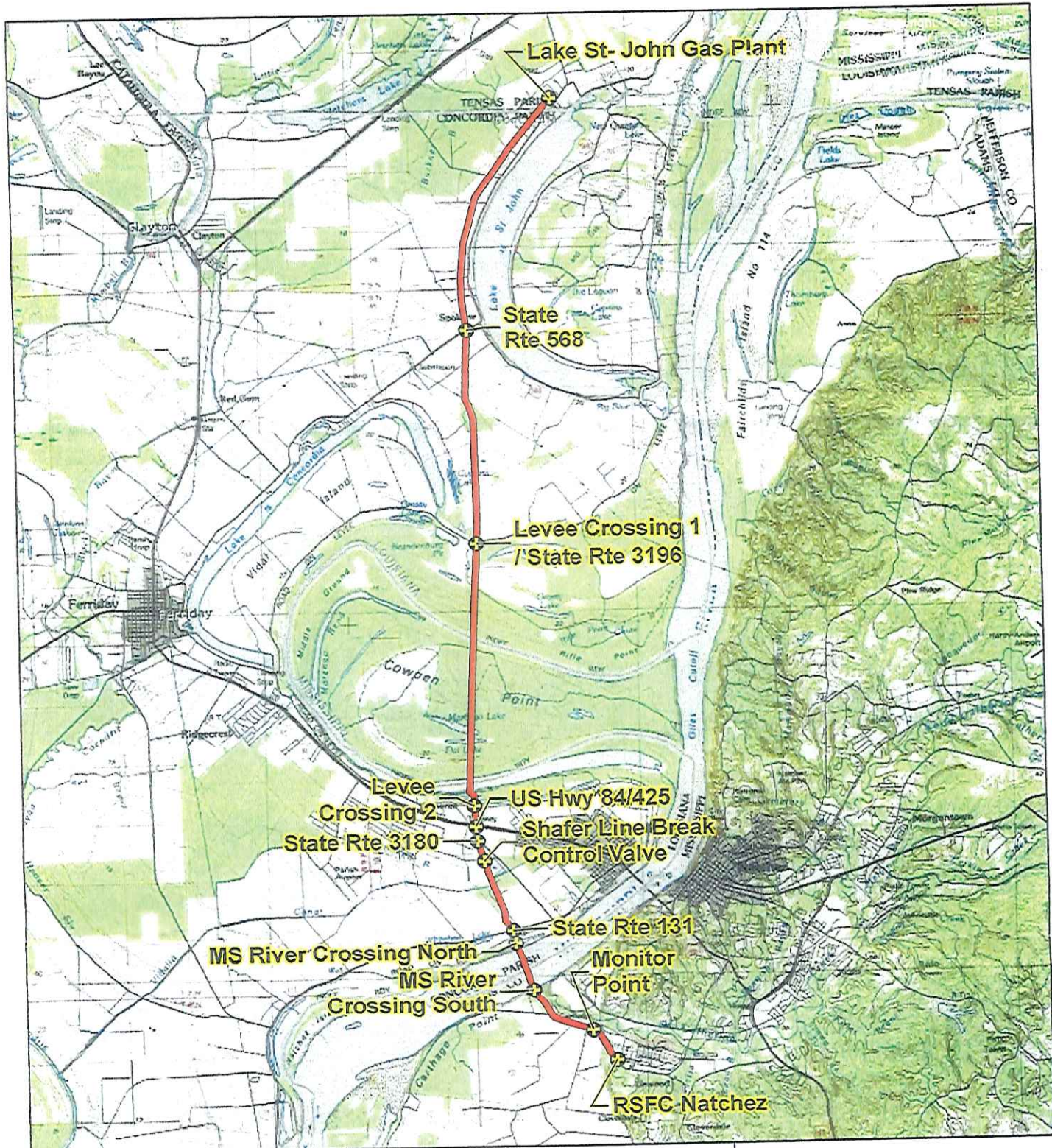
