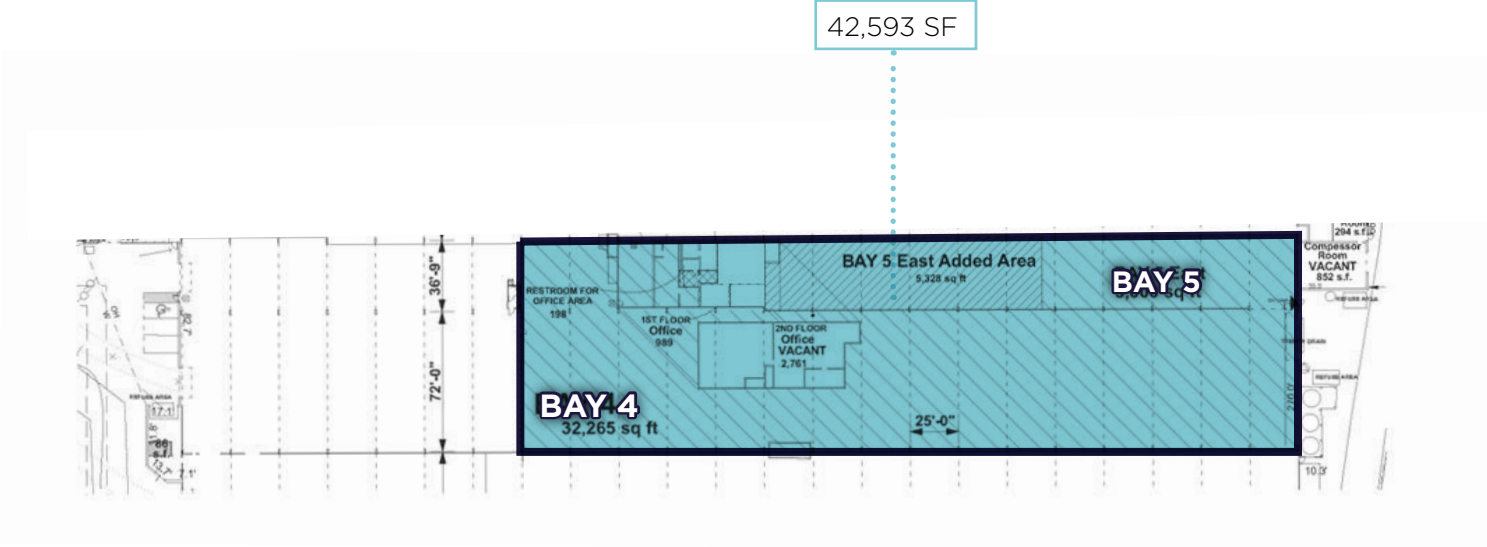

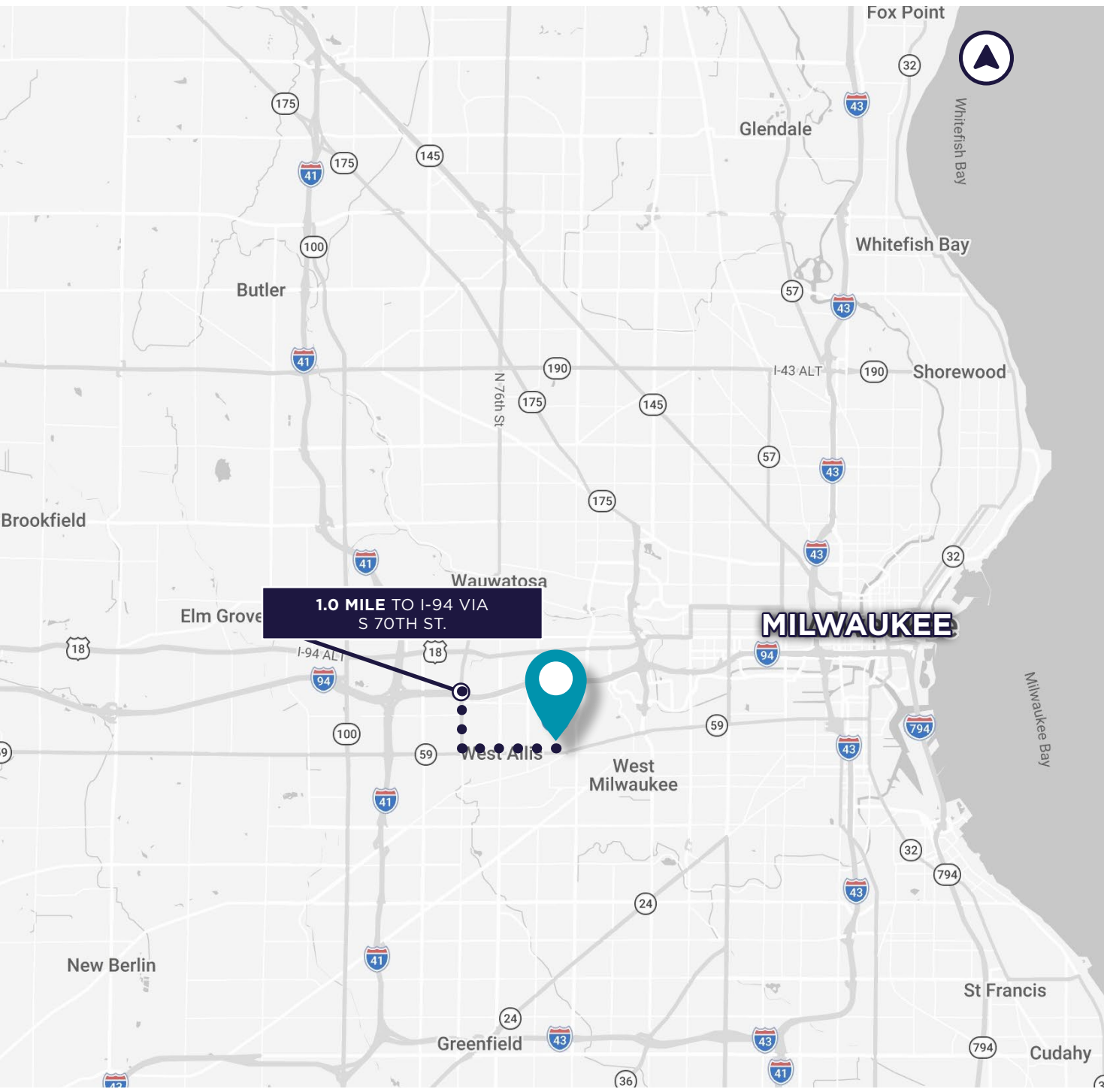

## DISCLOSURE TO NON-RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS

- (g) The duty, when negotiating, to present contract proposals in an objective and unbiased manner and disclose the advantages and disadvantages of the proposals.

### DEFINITION OF MATERIAL ADVERSE FACTS
