
Public Art

The Old Mill District holds more than 130 events a year, including 50-plus shows a year at the Hayden Homes Amphitheater as well as various runs and community events.




The Hayden Homes Amphitheater hosts more than 50 concerts a year, typically Memorial Day through September. The venue sold approximately 450,000 tickets over the 2022 and 2023 concert seasons.



Bend Brewfest Held annually in October at the Hayden Homes Amphitheater, the Bend Brewfest is the largest craft beer festival in the Pacific Northwest. Each fall, the Brewfest welcomes more than 100 breweries that pour 200-plus beers at the festival.

Lifestyle

As for work-life balance, Bend serves up big city amenities with small town advantages.

Almost 300 days of sunshine each year make cycling, running, hiking, mountain & rock climbing and golf year-round sports. Summers bring river rafting, stand up paddle boarding and kayaking to the forefront. Mt. Bachelor's slopes offer world-class skiing in the winter. Entertainment is year-round too, with film and music festivals, food and wine events, sports competitions and outdoor markets.

Bend has all the cultural opportunities and medical facilities of a a large metropolitan area, but with lower costs of living and short commutes. Bend is a place where you can happily raise families and get to know your neighbors. And, Bend is famous for its easy access to rivers, mountains, trails and lakes.

The Simpson Pavilion, located adjacent to the Old Mill District, is a covered, open-air recreation facility with a full-size ice rink in winter and multi-purpose recreation and sports courts in summer. Winter activities include skate, hockey, curling, figure skating and "learn to" classes.
























Tourism

Central Oregon attracts over 4.3 million visitors annually who contribute more than **\$1.7 billion*** into the local economy.

In 2022, Central Oregon lodging tax revenues

accounted for \$28.5 million. Of that total, Deschutes County, the home of Bend, was responsible for \$25.7 million.

More than 10,200 jobs were directly tied to travel spending in Central Oregon, an increase of 13.1 percent from 2021.

Transportation


By Air - Commerical With non-stop commercial flights and air service from major markets, getting to Bend, Oregon is quick and convenient. Redmond Municipal Airport (RDM) is 20 minutes from downtown Bend. Direct flights are provided by Alaska, Allegiant, American, Avelo, Delta, and United to Burbank, Denver, Los Angeles, Las Vegas, Phoenix, Santa Rosa, San Diego, San Francisco, Salt Lake City, and Seattle.

Education

As Oregon's largest city east of the Cascade Mountains, Bend is the commercial, recreational, and innovation center of Central Oregon.

OSU-Cascades Four-year university which offers 20 majors and 30 minors. The campus has expanded to a west side location near the Old Mill District. By 2025, enrollment is expected to jump to nearly 5,000, offering a sustainable campus model that will seamlessly integrate with the Bend community and lifestyle.

Cascade Culinary Institute (CCI) Accredited by the American Culinary Federation Foundation and offers degree programs in the Culinary Arts, Baking and Pastry Arts. The Jungers Culinary Center on campus is a cutting-edge facility featuring multiple kitchens, a demonstration theater and a student-operated restaurant called Elevation, where the public can also enjoy special farm-to-table dining events.

- Central Oregon Community College (COCC) Longest standing community college in all of Oregon. The 140-acre main campus accommodates over 17,000 students and includes a state-of-the-art Health Careers and Science Center that opened in 2012.
- Bend-LaPine School District One of the highest rated school systems in the state of Oregon. Boasting 33 elementary, K-8, charter, middle and high schools with over 18,000 students and growing. The average SAT score from Bend-La Pine graduates is 57 points higher than the state average.





History

The story of the Old Mill District began more than 100 years ago when two of the world's largest sawmills opened on the banks of the Deschutes River. For the next 78 years, the mills and their three soaring smokestacks dominated Bend's skyline and its economy.

The Old Mill District, built on the former site of the Brooks-Scanlon Mill, has once again become a major economic force in Bend, employing more than 5,000 people and drawing hundreds of thousands of visitors to its shops, galleries, restaurants and events each year.

The Hayden Homes Amphitheater, built on the former site of the Shevlin-Hixon Mill, is Bend's premier music venue, with a park-like setting that accommodates up to 8,000 patrons for top-name performances like Paul Simon, Tenacious D, Jack Johnson and the Dave Matthews Band.

Three prominent structures built in 1923 - the Fuel Building, Powerhouse Building and Electric Shop make up the Old Mill District's "powerhouse complex" with its distinctive three smokestacks. Well-loved landmarks that tie the town's past to its present, the smokestacks once again represent economic vitality.

Along with the healthy growth of the Old Mill District, Bend itself has become revitalized and is known throughout the country as one of the most popular vacation and outdoor recreation spots in the Pacific Northwest.
