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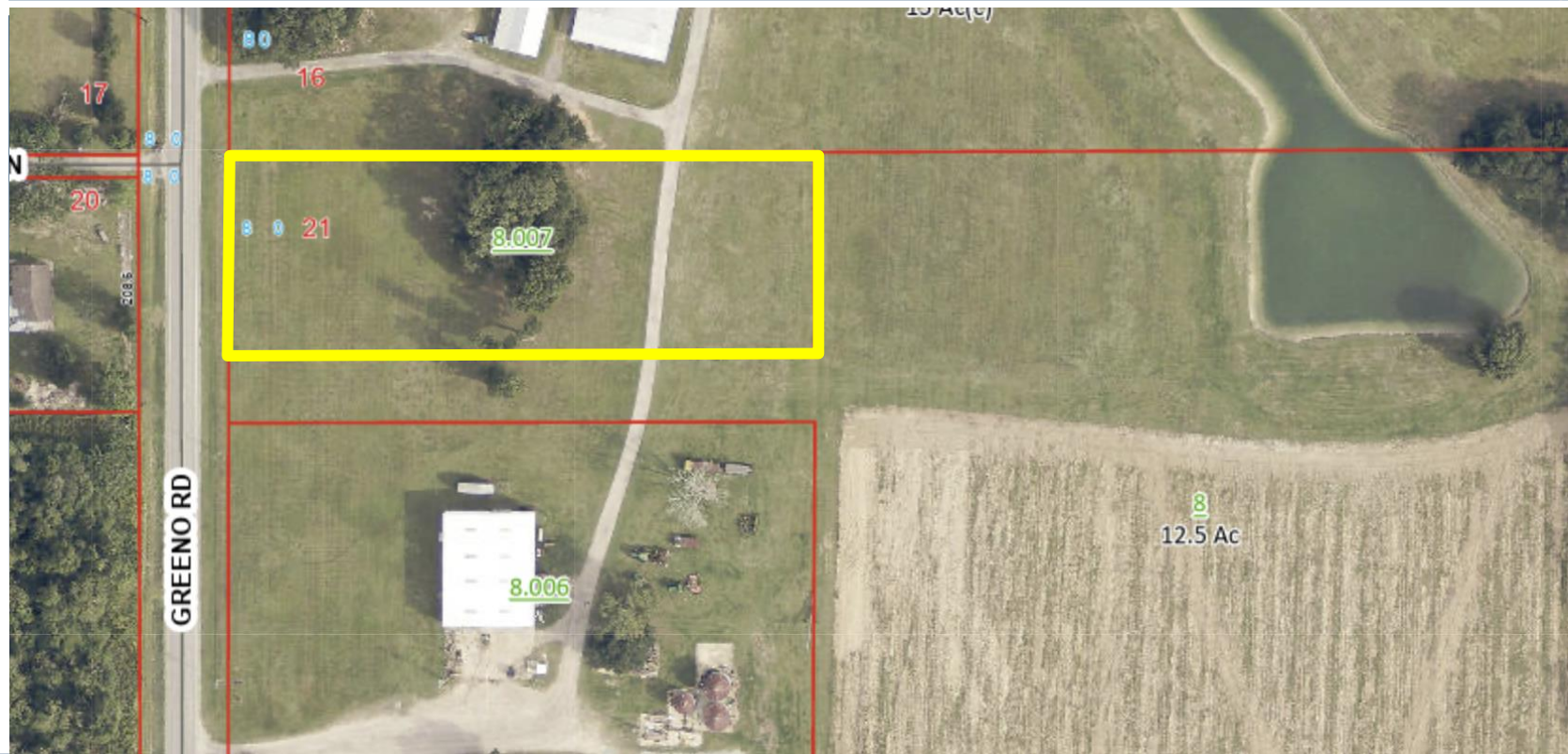

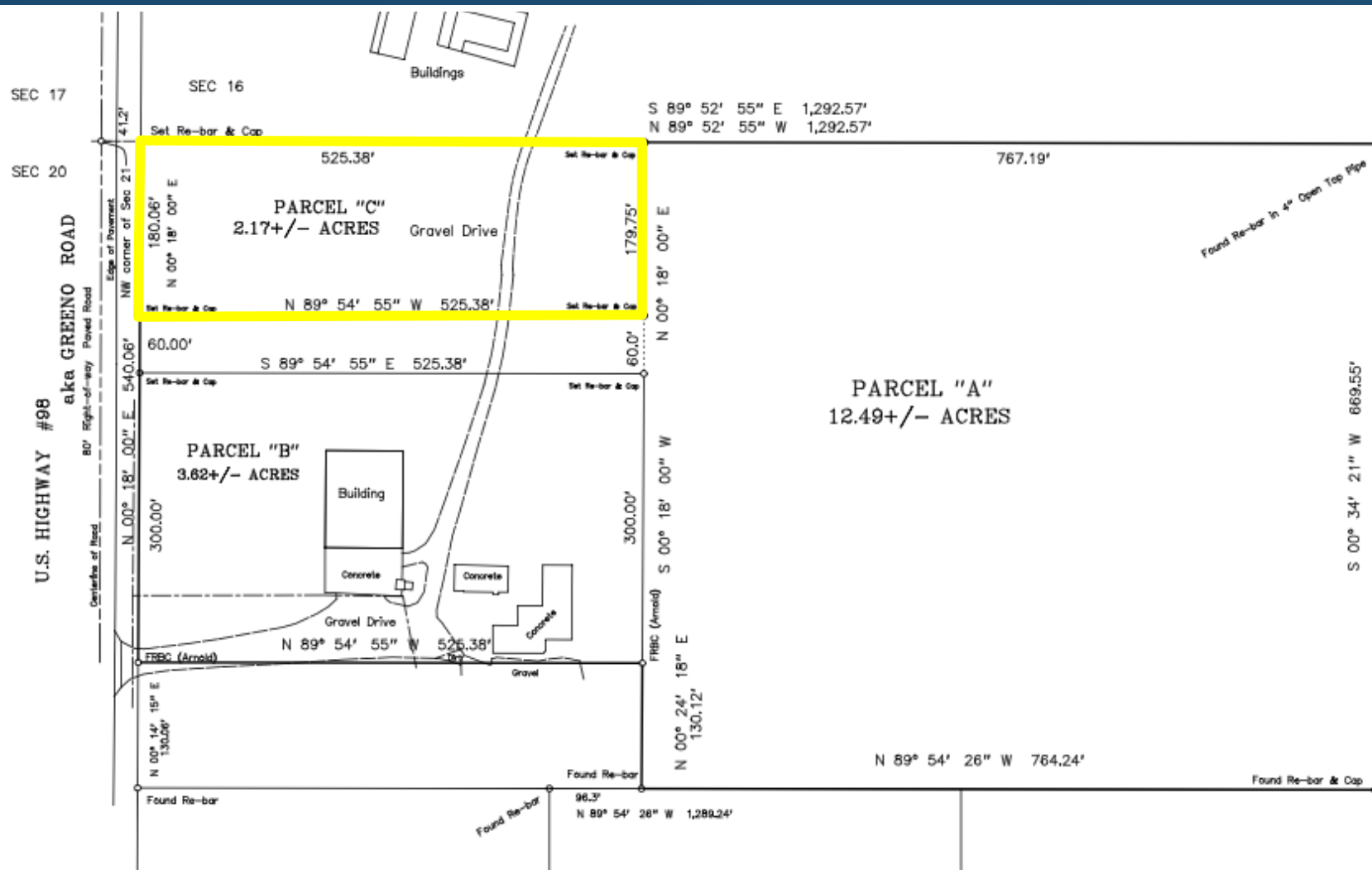

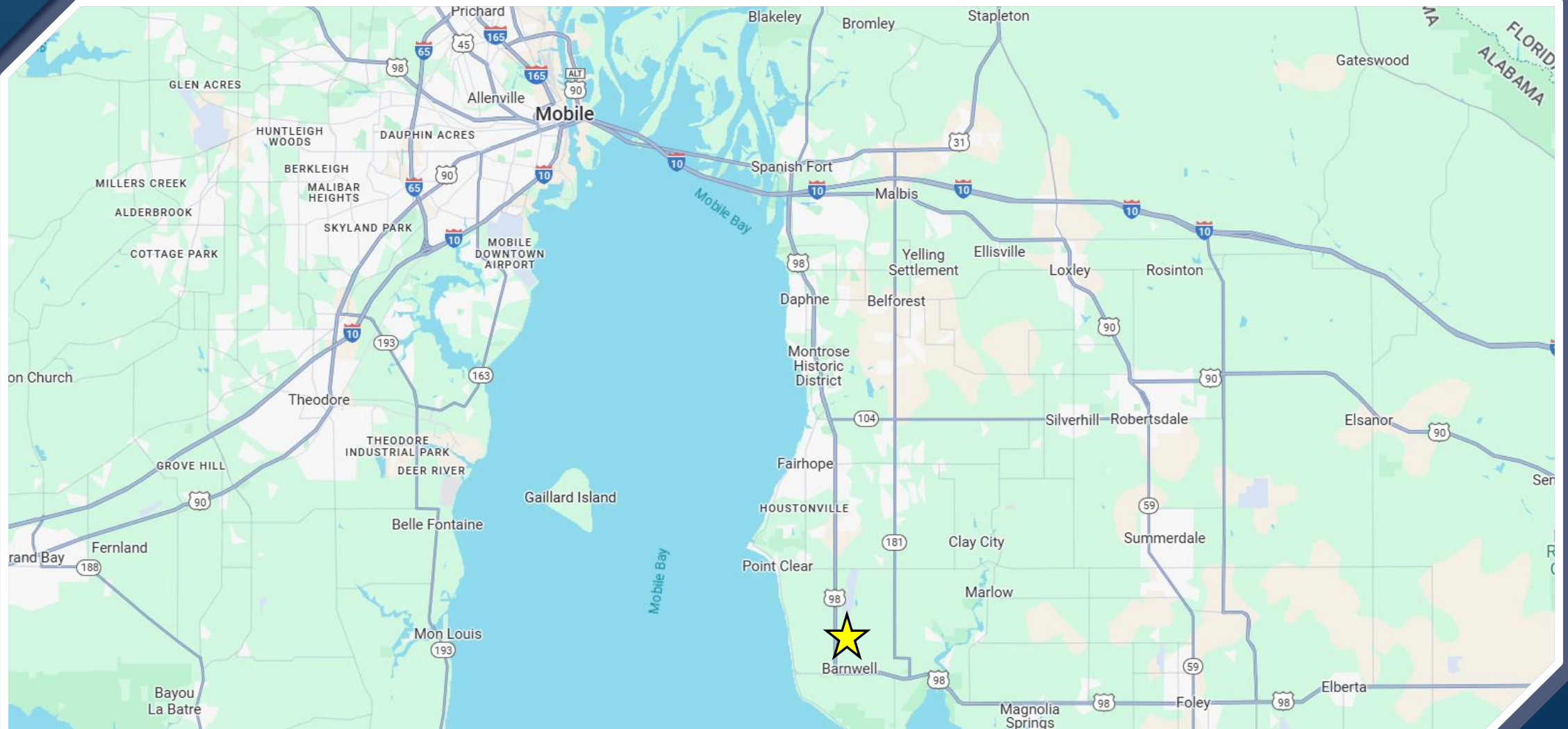

Fairhope, Alabama

Fairhope is a city in Baldwin County, Alabama on the eastern shoreline of Mobile Bay. Baldwin County has been one of the fastest growing counties in the state over the past 10 years and during that growth for the overall county, Fairhope stands in a league of its own. Fairhope has become home to some of the most sought-after real estate in the entire state and has been the beacon for growth along the coast. Fairhope has reported population growth of over 55% since 2010, resulting in a population of over 24,000 people.

Baldwin County, home to Alabama's famous beaches, is in the southwestern part of Alabama on the Gulf Coast. According the 2019 Census, the population exceeds 223,000 people. It is stated as the largest county in Alabama by area and is located on the eastern side of Mobile Bay. There has been a major shift in population on the gulf coast in the past few years as people are flocking to the beaches not just for the summer, but to live. Four of Alabama's 10 fastest-growing cities over the last decade and three of the top five are at or near the coast, showing the desire of Alabama residents to get closer to the coast. Two separate areas in Baldwin County have been designated as "Outstanding Alabama Water" by the Alabama Environmental Management Commission, which oversees the Alabama Department of Environmental Management, this recognition is considered the "highest environmental status" in the state. The pristine water on the coast of Alabama will continue to attract not only residents from around the state but also tourist from around the southeast for years to come.
