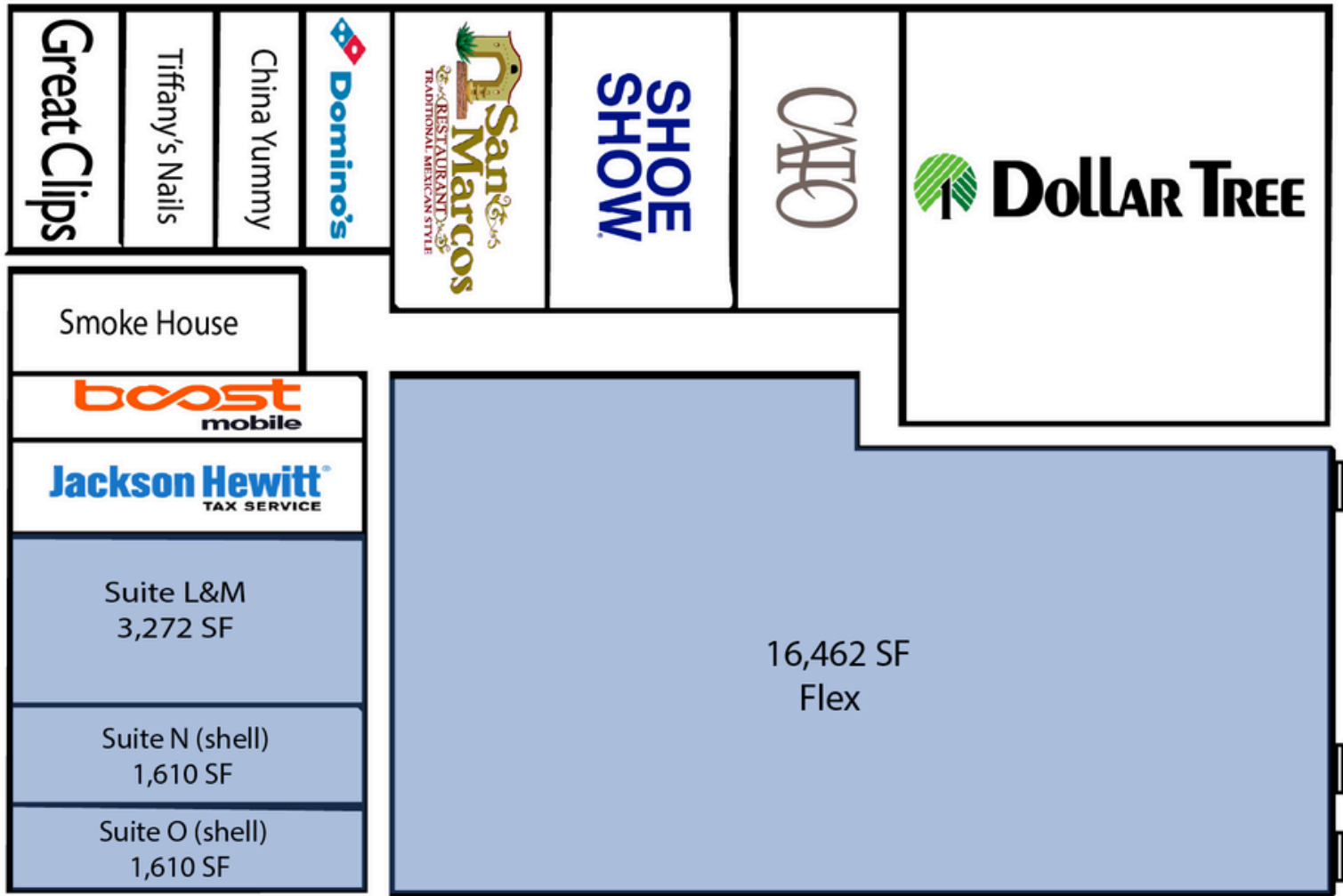

MAYODAN, NC

Mayodan, North Carolina, is a small town located in western Rockingham County, near the Virginia border. Established in the late 1800s, it grew around the Mayo Mill, a textile manufacturing plant that played a central role in the town's development. The name "Mayodan" comes from a combination of the Mayo and Dan rivers, which meet just outside town and have long been vital to the area's industry and recreation.

Historically, Mayodan thrived as a mill town, with the Washington Mills Company (later Tultex) serving as its largest employer for much of the 20th century. Though the textile industry declined in the late 1900s, Mayodan has continued to adapt and attract new businesses. One of its major employers today is Remington Arms, which opened a large manufacturing facility in town, helping to sustain the local economy.

The town is known for its small-town charm, friendly community, and scenic surroundings. Outdoor enthusiasts enjoy the nearby Mayo River State Park, which offers hiking trails, kayaking, fishing, and picnic areas along the Mayo River. The park showcases the natural beauty of the region and draws visitors from across the Piedmont and beyond.

Mayodan's downtown area retains a nostalgic, historic feel with locally owned shops, restaurants, and community events that bring residents together. Festivals, parades, and gatherings at Farris Memorial Park highlight the town's strong sense of community pride.
